

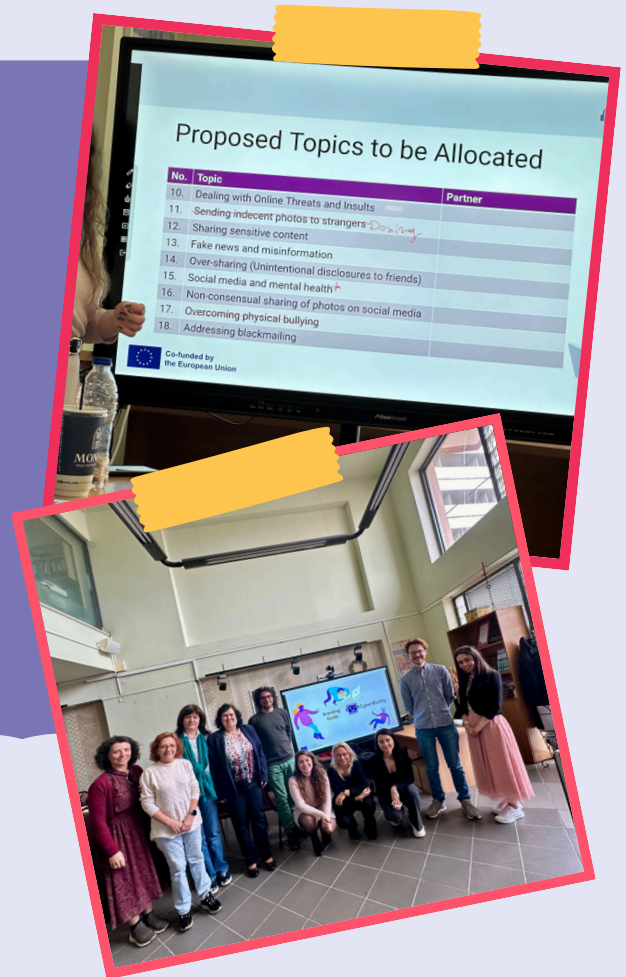

CyberBuddy kicked-off!

In March, 2024 the CyberBuddy consortium gathered in the beautiful town of Heraklion, Greece and kick started the project activities. The meeting was hosted by The Union of Women Associations of Heraklion (UWAH). Partners discussed the results from the survey distributed among students to identify their main concerns when it comes to cyberbullying. Other topics of discussion were means to effectively disseminate the project and ensure high quality of the results.



About the Survey

In order to identify the most helpful topics for students related to cyberbullying, the CyberBuddy consortium conducted a survey among high school students in partner countries. The main highlights are:

- 221 students surveyed in 5 countries;
- 158 were familiar with the term "cyberbullying";
- many of the students have personally experienced:
 - >>> inappropriate messaging;
 - >>> spread of rumours;
 - >>> hate speech & discrimination..

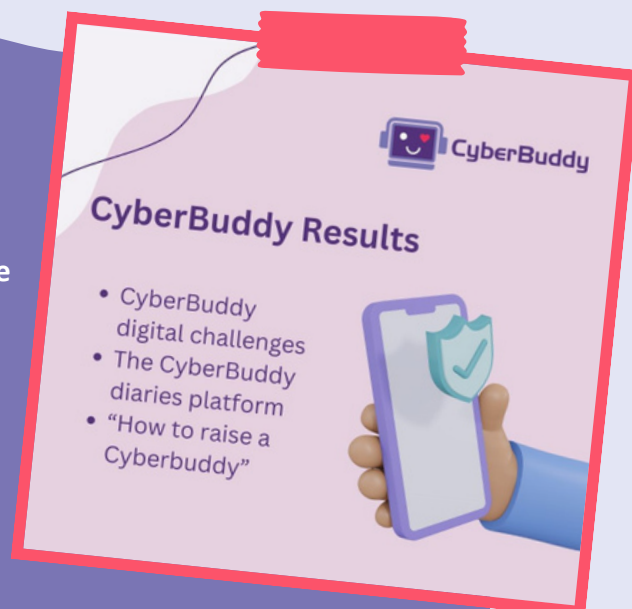
Our progress so far
